The Virtual Interview: Key Styling Tips to Consider

Necklines: Soft v necks to elongate. Try a contrasting colour trim (to the rest of the fabric) for detail. Avoid roll-necks. *Brands: Cefinn, Jigsaw, Sunspel, Winser London, SleekAtelier*

Colour: Stay safe in an array of blues/ teals/ aquas. Or embrace simple patterns that won't overpower your face or look 'too fashion' if the job is for someone corporate. If in doubt play it cautiously, ask yourself 'Would a news reader wear this fabric?'

Fabric: Be cautious of sweat patches if you are someone who gesticulates. Wear a fabric that glides rather than clings if big busted. If in doubt wear a jacket but only if the garment underneath is more casual. (A blazer and collared shirt might look too exaggerated in the virtual sphere).

Accessories: Pendants to elongate, or bold statement necklaces that sit against a simple (round) neckline and fabric at the neatest point (see below). Attempt a hairband or simple clips (slides) if you don't want to wear jewellery of any kind. It's okay to create a talking point/ break the ice with a great pair of earrings. Only focus on one area though (neck/ ears/ hair). Brands: Tilly Sveeas, Otiumberg, Missoma, &OtherStories

Make-Up: Eyes! If you do nothing else then get eyebrows perfected and apply a lick of mascara. *Brands: Benefit, Blink, WOW*
